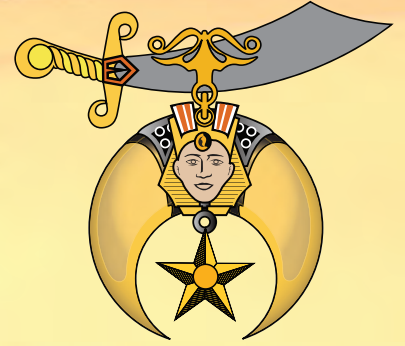

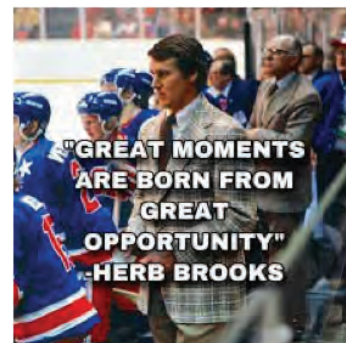

Chief Rabban's notes

Sometimes I reflect on my upbringing and the impact my parents and my family has had on my life. I suppose that this is natural, the majority of these thoughts are positive, some not so much when I recall the trouble I got into doing things that little boys do, even though we know we should not.

My father was a large man, almost six feet tall, broad at the shoulders with large thick hands, he always had a sparkle in his blue eyes. He worked in heavy construction as a pipe fitter and steam fitter, my family traveled all over the United States with his work. At some point, as I understand not too long after I was born, my mother said enough was enough and the family settled in Monmouth, Oregon. My father continued to travel for work. He would come home on the weekends or we might go to where he was living in Sunnyside, Washington. He was working in Hanford at the time and it was always fun and exciting for me.

The life lessons that my father taught me are everlasting, such as treat others as you want to be treated, always help those that are in need. Be respectful of others, be honest in your actions and deeds, help improve your community. He was a proud and a quiet man who taught these lessons by his actions and example.

In 1962 The Columbus Day storm hit the Willamette Valley. This was very large wind storm causing a lot of damage. The tower at Campbell Hall on the college campus was blown over, roofs from buildings flew off and many trees were blown down. When the storm had passed my father told me that we had a lot of work to do, being eleven years old I knew better than to question him.

The next morning, my father got his chain saw and we began cleaning up our yard. One large tree that had fallen over hit for front porch of the house, causing some damage. There were trees down everywhere, there was not one yard in the neighborhood that was not a mess. I was excited when we finished cleaning our yard, I wanted to go play and started to walk away. My father said no we still have work to do. That entire weekend my father continued using the chain saw, I continued to haul the brush into piles, we went from yard to yard. I remember asking my father why we were doing all this work. I never will forget his answer. He looked down at me smiled and said "because it is the right thing to do." I never heard anyone ask for help, we just did what was right.

Many years later, when I became a Master Mason, I received a phone call from my oldest nephew who was living in Texas at the time. He told me that he had heard that I had become a Master Mason, I confirmed that I had. He simply said that's ok it will be in the mail. I called him back and he did not answer his phone. A week later, a masonic ring arrived in my mail box. I called my nephew and asked where the ring had come from. He replied it was your fathers, your brothers did not become Masons so it was given to me. I have been the Master of my lodge here in Texas several times, but it is time for you to wear it.

My father lived his life in what I would call the Masonic Way, he taught me the Masonic Principles of brotherly love, belief and truth. I am glad for the upbringing that I have had and I am proud to be a Mason and a Shriner!

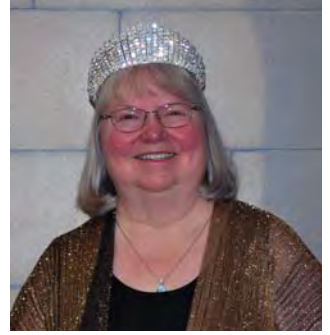

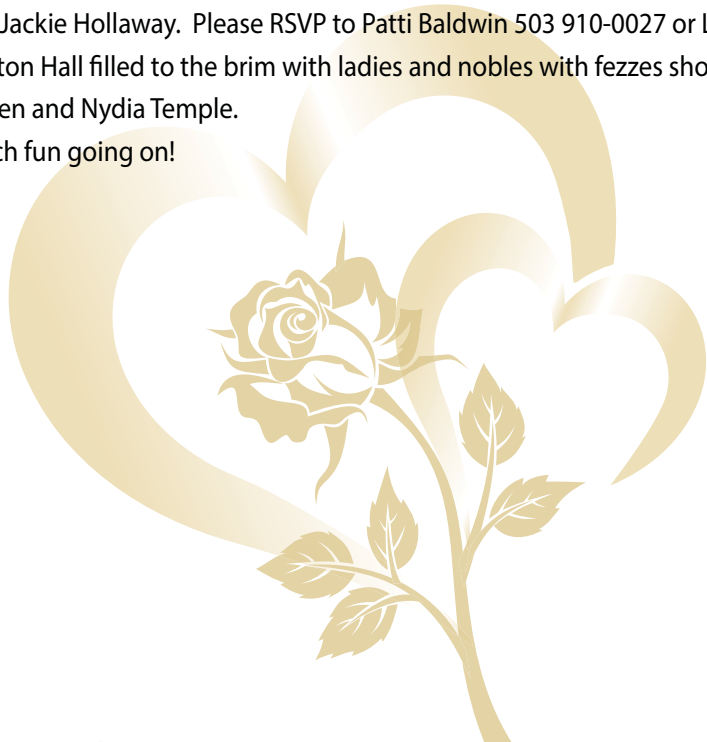

Answer: She was only 12 years old when she became the first patient into Portland's Shriners Hospital for Crippled Children. She was found by and referred by a compassionate group of Al Kader Shriners from Central Oregon Shrine Club. She "would not have lived through the 1924 winter" had they not answered her "silent" plea. She was Lulu Pickett.

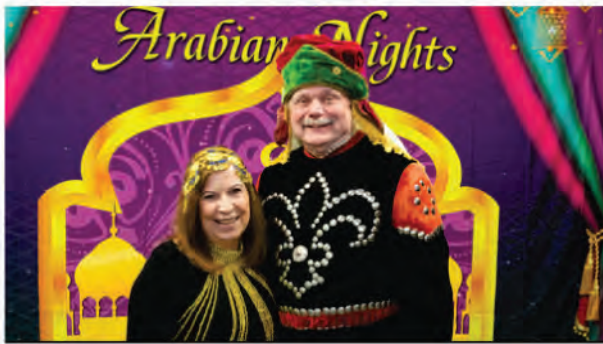
