


Our quote is from someone I admired not only as an actor, comedian, and philanthropist, but as one who spent years supporting the troops through USO performances and other military related charities.



CHIERATING 74 YHARS OF THE HARNITY COUNTY YOUTH AUCTION

In an article from the Burns Times Herald dated September 1950, they reported that Illustrious Sir Edward Swink and three other officers of Al Kader Shrine Temple in Portland visited Burns. Their mission was to meet with the Harney County Shrine Club officers and tour the Burns Packing Plant. They inspected and admired a 1,000-pound beef donated through the Harney County Shrine Club to the Shrine Hospital for Crippled Children (Shriners Children's) by Rocky Hill incorporated, owner of the Alvord Ranch.

Present for the tour were Illustrious Sir Edward Swink, Potentate of Al Kader, Noble Orville Corbett – Harney County SC, Noble Luther Duckworth- Recorder, Noble Rajah R.E Kriesien-Harney County SC, Noble John Rankin-Chief Rabban, Noble Bill Hamilton-Harney County SC and Noble Len Fuller-High Priest & Prophet.

The article acknowledged the Harney Shrine Club "as one of the smallest but most active clubs in the state". That reputation comes from their continuing involvement with the annual Youth Livestock Auction at the Harney County Fair. Donations of beef, swine, sheep, goats, chickens and the famous rabbits provide a valuable and significant resource to Shriners Children's in Portland. Financial records from as far back as 1998 reflect the monetary value of those donations exceed \$1,114,736!

It is extremely important that this tradition continues and that the ranchers that donate are acknowledged and feel valued. The Harney County SC needs your help with finding donors (old and new) to attend the 2024 4-H & FFA (Future Farmers of America) to purchase animals for donation. It will be held Saturday afternoon, September 7th. We also need Shriners just to attend with their fez to show appreciation for the donors. Please plan on attending and making the trip to Burns for the BBQ on Friday night and the parade on Saturday!


