

Sadly, what we are encountering is also a serious issue with the rest of the Pacific Northwest Temples.

Here are two major issues that needs to be addressed ASAP before it is too late...

Stated meetings. All of the Oregon and Washington temples have seen a dramatic reduction in attendance for stated meetings. We cannot set blame on COVID as that has run its course.

A Survey Monkey will be sent out to every Al Kader Noble to ask why Nobles are not attending Stated meetings, whether in person or on zoom. I would like to find out why there is such a dramatic decrease in attendance. Nile, Afifi, and Hillah are all suffering the same fate and nobody can figure out why.

Losing our Temple. Al Kader will slowly follow Afifi and Hillah and hold our meetings at other venues if we do not grow financially as well as with membership. I personally do not want to see this happen, and neither should you.

I would suggest what I was told by an Imperial Officer back at AR school. Go on Facebook and follow a thriving and growing Shrine temple. I have been following Ainad Shriners in St. Louis Missouri for years now. I know no Noble that is affiliated there, but I am astonished on what they do every month to keep their Nobles occupied and proud of being part of that Temple. They are constantly busy with event and money-making projects. Hopefully these other temples can raise a spark with you to try something new to bring in members and bring those Nobles back to our humble home.

Our conversation was a wake up call for me as I have been mentally struggling to figure out why these two abovementioned items have been such a huge impact to the future of Al Kader. It is up to each club and unit to build our membership up. We need to motivate everyone to do their part to bring our numbers back up to what they once were.

Over 100 years is a great legacy, but the University I graduated from closed its doors after 115 years due to financial instability and we are on the same course if we do not act now and get this boat from sinking into a dismal abyss.

Our quote this month is from someone everybody knows. Fred Rogers touched us in ways no other TV celebrity could ever have. His kind words and personal attraction to us made growing up less chaotic and gave us a sense of reassurance that we are all special in his neighborhood.






Clue: Many powerful meanings of the words "Al Kader" are blown across both the "cold sands" and "hot sands" of the desert by a strong or mighty force!




