

## **Editorial Without Words**

It has been said that the spoken word travels faster than the written word, these days with modern electronics I am not sure that is still true. A dream of a lifetime was accomplished this month thanks to the generosity of Herb Richarson, who was a fine caring man, a Master Mason and a Noble of Al Kader Shrine.

On November 16th, M.W. Grand Master Tim Best placed a wreath of flowers at the base of a newly erected statue of the "Editorial Without Words," in the parking lot of the Al Kader Shrine Center. This statue is commonly known as the "Silent Messenger" an iconic image of a noble who is carrying a small child and her crutches. The dedication ceremony was in honor of Noble Herb Richardson, who made this life time dream a reality for all of us at Al Kader.

On June 11, 1970 in Evansville, Indiana during the annual summer picnic held by Hadi Shriners Noble Al Hortman noticed a young girl who needed help. He lifted up Bobbie Jo Wright, her crutches and carried her from ride to ride. A local newspaper photographer, Randy Dieter captured the photo with a long lens after the two walked past him. The photograph was not planned in any way. In fact, the camera jammed, then they were too close, Randy had to run past them to take the picture with the last frame on the roll of film. This photograph illustrates the special relationship between the nobility and Shriners Children's.

Today, this simple photograph is reproduced in a variety of forms, including statues and is proudly displayed at hospitals and Shrine Centers throughout the country. It is a visual reminder to every one of the wonderful works that Shriners do each and every day.

A special thank you to Noble Dennis Harris, his son and son in law who worked with care and diligence in erecting the statue allowing a dream to come true.

## **CHARLENE MOODY**




