



The connection of Freemasonry to the Legion of Honor goes back to the very origin of the concept of the Legion d'Honneur. In 1802 Napoleon founded the French Honorary Society "Legion of Honor" for recognition of distinguished military and civil service. Still, the original Legion of Honor was loosely patterned after a Roman Legion, with legionnaires, officers and commanders in a chain of command.

During WWI, American Expeditionary Forces fought alongside the French army defeating the invading German army. Shrine Nobles from Maine, impressed by the French Legion of Honor, set out to form Units in their respective Shrine organizations. In October 1919, the Kora Temple in Plymouth, Maine created "the First Legion of Honor Unit in Shrinedom." Soon, there was a movement to petition Imperial Shrine for authorization to form a Shrine Legion of Honor. In 1922, during the 48th annual Imperial session, authority was granted. By 1931, eight Temples had Legion of Honor units. By 1961 there were 52 units; today there are about 150 Legion of Honor units.

The objectives of the Legion of Honor are:


- To foster a spirit of patriotism and love of our country and its flag
- To perpetuate the memory of our Comrades in Arms who died in the service to their country,
- To comfort those veterans who are disabled or infirm,
- To promote close Fraternal and social relationships.

Al Kader's Legion of Honor began on an informal basis and became a recognized Al Kader Club in the late '80s. Since then, the Legion's membership has expanded to include Shriners statewide. There are now three Legion of Honor Platoons within Al Kader; each memorializing a Noble. The Mid-Valley Platoon was renamed the Hap Baldwin Memorial Platoon on September 13, 2023; the North Coast Platoon is now named the Noble Carey Huckaba Memorial Platoon; the recently formed Scott Brasher Memorial Platoon is in Bend. (There is a fourth Platoon in Oregon, a part of Southern Oregon's Hillah Shrine).

Membership in our Legion of Honor has diminished as Nobles are pressed into positions in the Divan and other leadership roles as well as having responsibilities in other Masonic bodies. A reminder ... membership is available to any member of Al Kader Shrine who is in good standing and is serving or has been honorably discharged from the Armed Forces of his country, including National Guard and Reserve units and the Coast Guard.

Illustrious Sir Forrest has directed me to pursue re-forming a no-longer-in-existence platoon in the Hermiston-Pendleton area. It was here that the Al Kader Legion of Honor was first established in Oregon. We don't know why/how it came to disappear – but the perfect opportunity for re-creating it is almost here ... the next Al Kader Stated Meeting will be held in Pendleton on April 21st. If enough Nobles (more than 4) meet the LoH membership criteria we can create and charter a fourth platoon while we're there! So, please contact me for more information and/or membership petitions ...




