




worldwide. I am sure that we all learned a lot about the pediatric and prosthetic services that are provided by his team.


Chief Rabban's notes

Ahoy Mates, Cruise time for Al Kader Shriners

This year we have two opportunities to cruise with our Brother Nobles and their Ladies. The first is our Potentates Cruise 2026 in February (if Elected of course) to the Southern Caribbean. We will be sailing from Ft Lauderdale to Princess Cays, St Thomas, St Maarten, Antigua, St Kitts, and Tortola. This is a ten day cruise (as opposed to a three day cruise on the S.S.Minnow) Our arrangements are being handled by Griff's Travel Company. The second opportunity is our Chief Rabban Fundraiser for this year. We are raffling off a choice of one of two cruises. Your winning raffle chance allows you to go to either the Pacific Wine Country cruise or the Mexican Riviera cruise. The Mexican Riviera departs from LA for a seven day round trip with stops in Cabo San Lucas, Mazatlan, and others. Assistant Rabban's notes

As Shriners we are proud of our philanthropy; as we should be. Over the ongoing past 100 plus years we have created a hospital system that has provided better lives for over 1.5 million children. We have provided specialized care to children and their families, regardless of their ability to pay.

We were able to provide this care through donations, income from our trust fund and insurance reimbursements. And, for the past few years, we have covered a 1 plus billion dollar budget without touching the principle of the trust fund.

Which brings us to the point of this article; charitable donations. People donate for a variety of reasons. Many donate because they believe that our Shriner's kids deserve this care. Others are interested in the tax benefit that comes with their donations. And, for some, it's both.


What is my point? We have all heard the adage that charity begins at home. At a time when our hospitals are doing well financially, our temple is not. Like many others across the system, we are facing financial challenges. And, what will happen to our hospitals if we are not here to support them?

We are in the process of setting up a fund for donations to the temple. The income from this fund would be used to offset the costs of keeping our temple open and operating. If we would, in our life's end planning, consider leaving something to the temple we could build a fund that would eventually grow to an amount that would keep our temple going indefinitely. You should consult your tax advisor for those bequests.

For those making annual contributions and using the standard income tax deduction, you lose the tax benefit of donations to charities. So, redirecting some of those contribution will not have any tax consequences. Since we are a fraternal organization, not a charitable one, the tax benefits for contributions to the temple are not deductible.

The time is now to start building security for our temple. I'm not suggesting that you give all to the temple. But let's consider the outcomes if we do not start taking care of our Shrine home.



Another activity I have found rewarding is visiting another Shrine or Lodge. You will probably find a warm welcome, meet new people and have a positive experience.


It can also be a great experience to visit a Brother, Noble, or Widow who you have not seen for a while.



A HOME TIKI BAR TOUR

What is PDXotica? This is a question I hear often, and never tire of answering. PDXotica is a three day celebration of all things Tiki in Portland. For 20 years there was Tiki Kon, a Tiki convention first held at Kenton Lodge in North Portland for a handful of folks, and its last iteration hosted 1,000 people at the DoubleTree at the Lloyd Center in 2023.

For August 15-17, 2025 Al Kader Shrine is working with the Tiki Community to revive this festival of fun and polynesian fantasy with a three day party full of fruity drinks, floral leis, festive banquets, and a home Tiki Bar tour. On both Friday and Saturday of the event, the 400 participants will travel each day to three home Tiki Bars and one commercial venue. The day will begin with an elimination challenge for our Master Mixologist Competition, and then we head to the buses, with 50 participants on each bus along with their Skipper and First Mate for a five hour tour. The buses arrive back to the Shrine Center around 5pm for happy hour, the Tiki Marketplace upstairs, and a chance to check out our fun parade fleet of vehicles (if staffing permits). On Friday evening we will have a luau, another mixologist challenge, Hawaiian dancers, and a band. Buses will then take our participants back to the Holiday Inn Wilsonville South, where room parties and further frivolity will occur. Saturday will be more of the same, but with different home bars, commercial venues, and the dinner will be an Asian inspired feast followed by another elimination challenge, a "tame" burlesque show, and a band. Whoever is still standing on Sunday (literally) will come back to the Shrine Center for the final Mixologist challenge, a light breakfast, and a fond farewell.

Our goal for this event is to raise \$30K for the Shrine Center and gain 5 new Shriners. We already initiated two new Shriners during the Spring Ceremonial who are looking forward to participating in PDXotica, two more from Kenton Lodge, one of the home bar hosts, and hopefully many more from those attending the event. We will need all hands on deck as this is not a unit specific fundraiser, but an Al Kader fundraiser. There are a number of Afifi Nobles from Gateway Shrine Club already committed to help, and a group from Sacramento planning to make the trek up as well. Hopefully you can mark these dates off on your calendar and come help work a Shrine event like you have never seen before!
