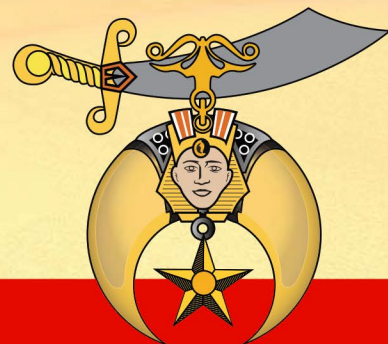

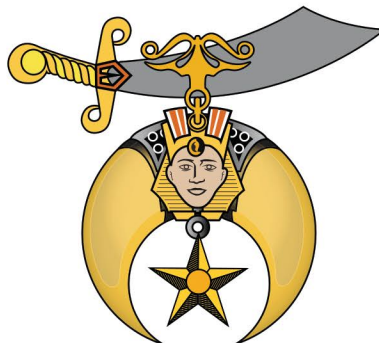
At four thirty each day we would gather for "Ohana" time and share our experiences for that day. (I am told the word Ohana means family time in Hawaiian).

It is never too late to strengthen family relationships.



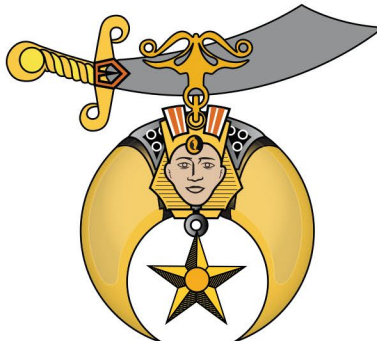
Chief Rabban's notes

The installation of the Queen and officers had an audience of over 1,500. A hosted reception with punch and cake followed. Many long time or newly made friends stayed afterward to visit, to meet and chat with members from the USA, Canada, Mexico, Brazil, Bolivia and other countries.

To you ladies involved, thank you all for your support of Supreme Queen Kathy these past 3 years as she now begins her journey. May you all enjoy safe travels and have a lot of fun.

Imperial Potentate Sir Richard Burke, Dr. Leslie D. Stewart, President of Shriners Children attended as well as Imperial Sir Larry Leib, Imperial Assistant Rabban.

A check from the Daughters for 2.2 \$ million to the Foundation with another \$500,000 from the Canadian Foundation and Gentlemen of the Creeks contributed \$37K – a record. Dereesa Reid, Portland Hospital Administrator, and Angie Gofredo, Development office attended the installation. Deressa spoke of Kathy's over 14 years of volunteering, as a van driver, hospital guide, and active in the new Ambassador program (which Kathy helped start).

Deressa told us the hospital, (with the help of this year's "Dream Girls" – all Temple Queen's donations), will be creating a rose garden at our hospital in Kathy's honor.

At the formal dinner Dr. Stewart announced he was just notified of an infant in South America that had been severely burned and in need of immediate specialized burns treatment. He was on his cell to Tampa to arrange an air ambulance to fly the child to one of our Shriner's burns centers. A shining example of how our work, partnered with Daughters of the Nile, is truly always there to help patients, sometimes saving their lives.

Kathy arranged for a local Shriner's patient to speak. Although she lives with a prosthetic leg, she is an amazing athlete, a 4-point student and a brilliant speaker at age 15.

It seems everyone at the Session had a great time. I certainly did.

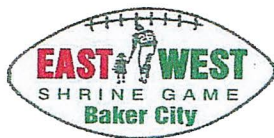
