## An Epic Adventure ~ Imperial Session

I had the privilege of attending the Imperial Session for Shriners International which was held in Atlanta, Georgia in July. This was the fourth Imperial Session that I have attended, each one was special in its own way. The experience of being surrounded by hundreds to thousands of fellow Shriners from around the world is something that you have to feel to believe. The camaraderie, the energy, and the overwhelming sense of unity is unmatched. I would encourage each Noble to attend an Imperial Session, it is an experience that you will never forget.

We all are familiar with the various conditions that Shriners Children's provide for children regardless of the family's ability to pay or their insurance status. The most exciting announcement that I have ever heard at an Imperial Session was revealed this year. Shriners Children's is opening a Research Institute.

The following article appeared in the Aladdin Lamp, a monthly publication by Aladdin Shriners from Grove City, Ohio. Since this article provided the information that I wanted to share with the nobility this month, I have simply submitted their article.

Governor Brian P. Kemp announced that Shriners Children's will establish a new pediatric medical research facility in Atlanta, Georgia. In addition to creating 470 new jobs, Shriners Children's will invest more than \$153 million into the facility at Science Square. This facility will be a first of its kind research institute for Shriners Children's, positioning the nonprofit healthcare system as a

significant player on the global stage by utilizing its expansive network of pediatric specialists and researchers to provide life changing care and innovative new treatments.

"We are thrilled to be establishing this new center for world class pediatric medical research in Georgia," said Shriners Children's Chairman of the Board of Trustees Dr. Leslie D. Stewart. "The opportunities to advance our research through collaborations and partnerships such as the one with Georgia Tech made Atlanta the clear choice."

# Potentate's notes

The proposal for a Shriners Children's Research Institute grew from a collaboration that started in 2019 between the Georgia Institute of Technology Pediatric Innovation Network and the Shriners Children's research department, headquarters in Tampa, Florida. Since then, the two groups have produced 25 joint research projects, such as robotic exoskeletons to assist patients with cerebral palsy and wearable sensors to monitor sleep problems in cleft lip and palate patients.

"The Shriners Children's Research Institute will serve as a multidisciplinary innovation hub to advance the healthcare of children," said Dr. Marc Lalande, Shriners Children's Vice President of Research Programs. "The close partnership with the outstanding biomedical engineers and scientists from Georgia Tech and Emory University will accelerate discovery and spearhead new treatments and therapies."

Shriners Children's provides world-class care to kids with orthopedic conditions, burns, spinal cord injuries, and cleft lip and cleft palate, regardless of a family's ability to pay or insurance status. The nonprofit healthcare system also offers specialized services like motion analysis and custom orthotics and prosthetics. For over a century, Shriners Children's has treated more than 2 million children, with patients coming from across the U.S., Canada, and 128 countries just last year alone.

"The establishment of this Research Institute will accelerate research discoveries that benefit not just our patients but children around the world," Dr. Lalande said. "Shriners Children's research that began decades ago is helping patients today, and we are confident that the research we are doing now, from genomics, motion analysis, artificial intelligence and much more, will drive tangible results far into the future."

As Shriners we all can be proud of our philanthropy as Shriners Children's continues thrive, grow and adapt while providing the best comprehensive care anywhere.






### **Your Temple Wants You!!**



# Chaplain's notes

Studies have shown among ways to improve your life and live longer are to exercise, get regular medical checks, be active, be involved and practice faith. Some critics of our fraternity say it is a substitute for church or religious affiliation. My reply to that is we embrace people of all religious faiths. We all believe in a higher power, for many of us it is God. We have a Bible or other books of faith on our alter at all of our meetings. What a great organization! Many of our members are also leaders and involved in their churches of their faith.

Prayer is a vital practice in many faiths that takes many forms. In our fraternity it is practiced at the beginning of our gatherings and in other situations. How we pray is not as important as we do pray. Our protocol directs us to offer prayer at the beginning of our meetings. Or at "the beginning of every great and good endeavor," or in time of need.

In our Al Kader Shrine LEADERSHIP TRAINING MANUAL there is a page on Chaplain's Comments that refers to prayer protocol. There is also a section that can be helpful in conducting unit and club meetings that includes a suggested prayer.

In our bylaws it is noted that there are no Sunday meetings so we can attend our houses of worship. There is little more prayer direction other than our prayers are non-denominational as we embrace people of all religions. A noble wearing a Fez is directed to remove it and place it over his heart in an upright position. It is also noted crossed arms and bowing are appropriate only in Lodge.

How to pray doesn't have to be complicated, fancy or formal. It is a conversation with God or the Deity of your particular faith. It can come from the heart and be thankful and include petitions and requests. A pastor, priest, rabbi, chaplain, or religious leader can be of assistance. Prayers can be a helpful daily routine to help your life. Also, like everything now days the internet can be helpful (and like everything use a good source).
