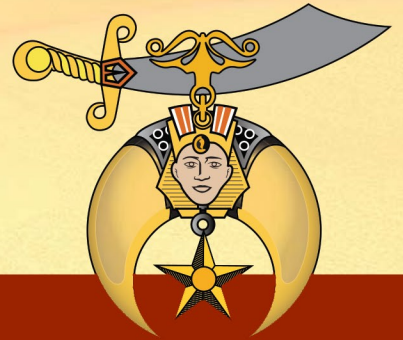

Speaking of support for Shriners Children's did you know that the majority of the protein that is used by the hospital during the year is provided from the Harney County Youth Livestock Auction? WE ALL OWE NOBEL BILL QUIER A BIG THANK YOU FOR MAKING THIS HAPPEN. I do not know how long he has been doing this; however, records of the donations go back to 1998! Our recorder IS Ron Gamble describes him as a hero and I agree wholeheartedly!

This year there were approximately 500 individuals who attended the auction. I was so proud of each and every noble and lady from Al Kader who attended, THANK YOU ALL! There were sixteen nobles and five ladies that attended the auction.

There are three ways to purchase an animal during the auction; (1) purchase for your own consumption; (2) purchase and donate to a charity; or (3) floor the animal. Over the years the number of organizations that receive the benefit of donations has increased. This year donations were made to Shriners, Make a Wish Foundation, Crane School, and the Senior Center.

Well, by now you might be thinking that your Potentate is going off the deep end, because he is going on and on and this is not really that important to what we do as Shriners. Well, if you had this thought, you

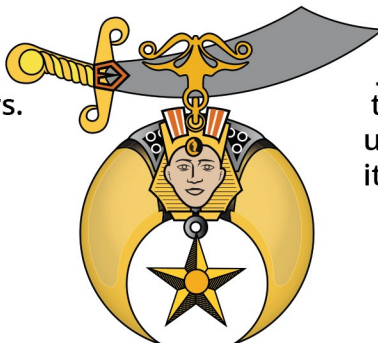
would be wrong! Well at least as far as the importance of this event anyway.

This year, the donations to Shriners Children's Hospital from the auction is a total of \$80,632.75. this is the largest donation for the last four years. There have only been two years since 1998 that had higher total donations, 2017 and 2018 both exceeded \$88,000.00.

According to the records dating back to 1998, total donations from this auction have been \$1,264,940.62. I think that you would agree that this is a very important weekend!

After the auction the Oriental Band invited everyone out to dinner at a local steak house. There were twenty-three (23) nobles and ladies who got together for a fine meal and fellowship. 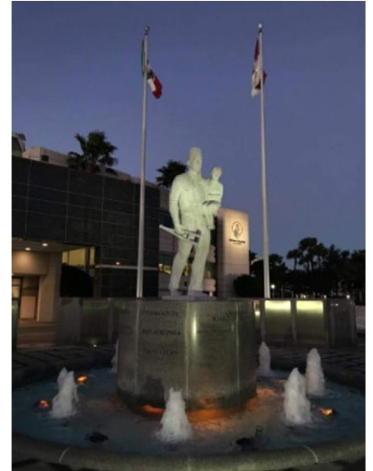
Nobles, One and All;

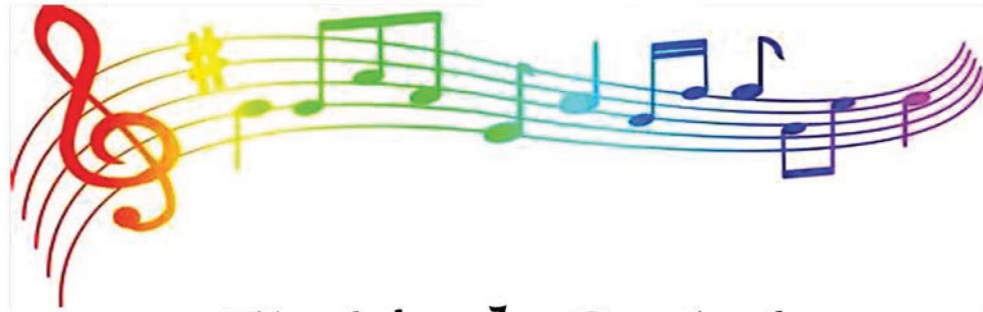
##### *How Does Music Therapy Make a Difference with Young Children*

- Music is highly motivating, yet it can also have a calming and relaxing effect. Enjoyable music activities are designed to be success-oriented and make children feel better about themselves.
- Music therapy can help a child manage pain and stressful situations.
- Music can encourage socialization, self-expression, communication, and motor development.
- Because the brain processes music in both hemispheres, music can stimulate cognitive functioning and may be used for remediation of some speech/language skills.

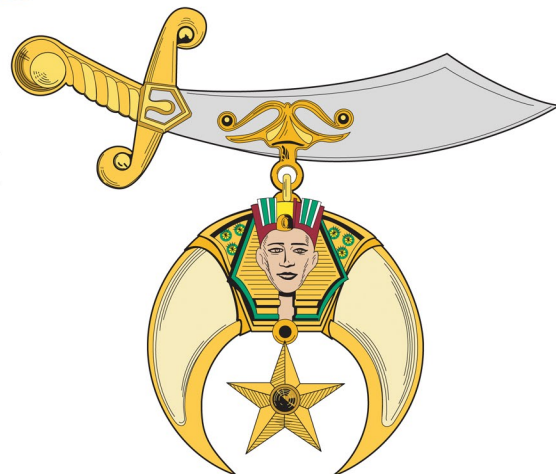

Our calling is higher than interjecting ourselves in the political drama of the hour. We want our fraternity to be seen as a force for good in a troubled world. Instead of being drawn into the fray, let us reflect on these tragic events and strive to grow in understanding and compassion.

Through our words and deeds, we can lead the way in mending our country, demonstrating character, compassion and a devotion to unselfishly making the world a better place for all.
