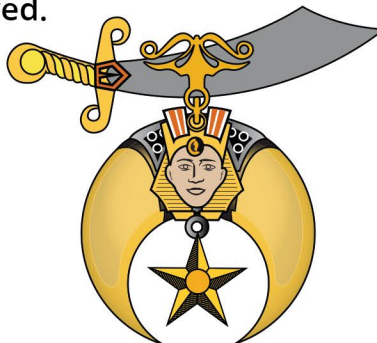
# High Priest & Prophet's notes

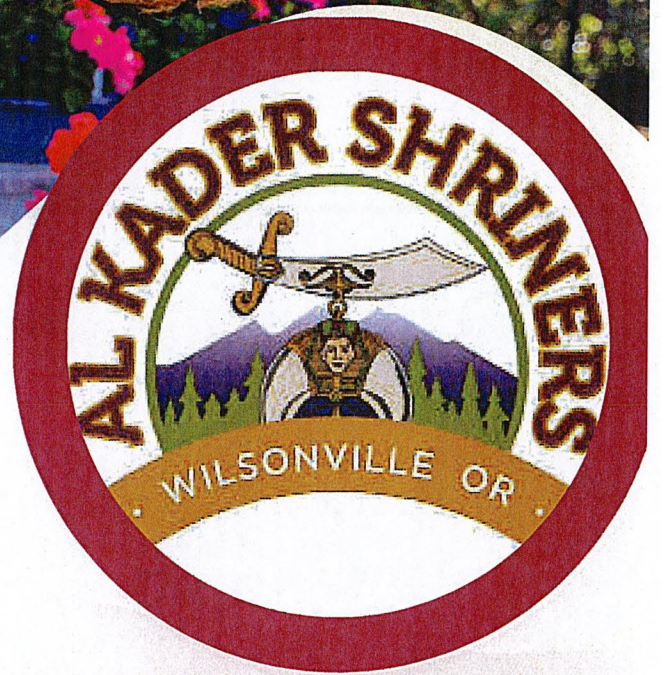

# FOURTH LEGION OF HONOR PLATOON FORMED

On April 1, 2026, I, S. Forrest Hatch, Noble Al Harrison, Commander of Al Kader's Hap Baldwin Memorial Platoon and I attended the Desert Shrine Club's stated meeting in Hermiston. The purpose of the visit was to continue fulfilling I. S. Art Hermanson's mandate for creation of additional LoH Platoons – a mandate given me in 2018.

Today, there are about 160 Legion of Honor units worldwide. During WWI, Shriners from Maine, impressed by France's Legion d'Honneur members, set out to form Units in their respective Shrine organizations. In October 1919, the Kora Temple in Plymouth, Maine created the, "First Legion of Honor Unit in Shrinedom." The requirement for LoH membership is simply that one has served (or is serving) honorably in the military including reserve units, National Guard and Coast Guard. Some years later, a legion was formed in the Hermiston area; it faded out of existence, but was not forgotten.

**The objectives of the Legion of Honor are:**

**To comfort those veterans who are disabled or infirm**

**To promote close Fraternal and social relationships**

**To foster a spirit of patriotism and love of our country and its flag**

**To perpetuate the memory of our Comrades in Arms who died in the service to their country**

Then-Potentate Forrest and I visited the Club's Stated Meeting in October to assess and rekindle interest in recreating a Platoon there. We were invited back to complete the process. After discussion at the April meeting, it was unanimously voted to form a new Platoon, the "Clyde Nobles Memorial Platoon." Three petitions for membership were received from the three veterans (of the 15 Nobles in attendance) and three Legionnaires were created on the spot.

Nobles, take a few minutes and think back when you took your obligation as a Master Mason then as a Shriner, I mean seriously take time and reflect on this time. Do you remember how excited you were? Do you remember how committed you were to the fraternity? Do you remember the joy that you felt? Do you remember the secret promises that you made to yourself?

It has been said, "the healthiest response to life is joy!" Do you have joy in your life? Or are you just getting by each and every day? I think that each of us are happier when we live up to our obligation each and every day.

I recently talked with a former co-worker at a local grocery store. (This individual has has never been really excited about life. It seemed that he just went from day to day.) In talking with him today, I asked him what he was doing now that he is retired. He replied not much of anything, nothing really just getting by day-by-day. He mentioned that our group of co-workers no longer meets for coffee, at least no one has contacted me. I think that this is a sad and depressing situation, I have attempted to get this individual interested in joining the Masonic fraternity, he indicated that he has no interest. I wonder how many Master Masons, Shriners or members of other concordant bodies are just going about their lives one day after another.

We have the best fraternal organizations in the world; we all have those who truly care about each of us! Let's not forget that we have an obligation to help all of our Masonic Brothers and Sisters. It is not difficult these days to just reach out to a member of our fraternity and tell them that we care and are ready and able to help in any manner that they may need.



One thing that every Mason has in common is that we are all very proud, as a result we have a tendency not to ask for help. Let's break that mold and reach out to each other and to the Grand Lodge for assistance. There are programs in place, the Grand Lodge staff have resources beyond our reach, let them help!

Several years ago, a Master Mason and Shriner went to the place not made with human hands. He was a friend, a brother who was loved and respected by many. Over the years, he had become disconnected from his children, in the last days of his life they reconnected. I received a phone call from his daughter who was distraught and upset. She related to me that the family did not know what to do, the mortuary staff would not release her father's remains until they were paid for the services they had performed. I listened to her while she explained through tears the family's financial situation, they had tried everything they could think of. I reassured her that I would find her some help, even if that meant I took up a collection.

I contacted the Grand Lodge and made the staff aware of this family's situation, providing the daughter's name and contact information. The next day I received another phone call from the daughter who was grateful and appreciative of the Masons and how they helped her family when they were in need. The Oregon Grand Lodge staff stepped up and helped by being sure the service could be held; they paid for everything. A couple of months later several Masons had the privilege of attending this nobles service at the Willamette National Cemetery where he received military honors.

I would encourage each and every one of us to seriously consider the obligation that we all have taken. Ask yourself, "am I living up to that obligation?" Ask yourself, "is my life full of joy?" If your answer is no, then I suggest that you determine why not. Each of us can make our lives more joyful, it is simply all we need to do is live up to our obligation and participate!
