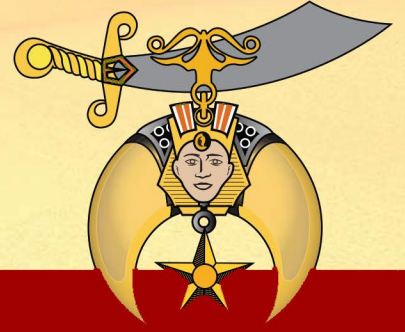

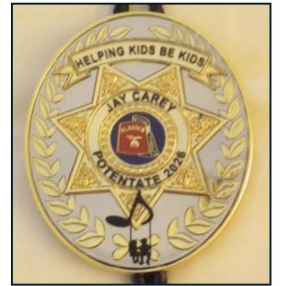

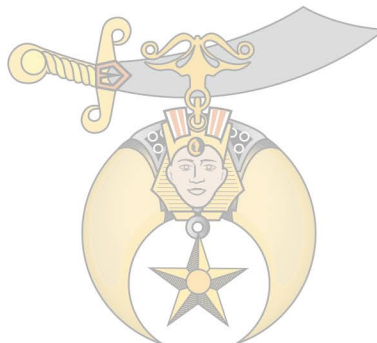


Happy Birthday to one and all. On July 4th, 2026 we celebrate this country's 250th birthday. Celebrate our freedoms and land that we love!

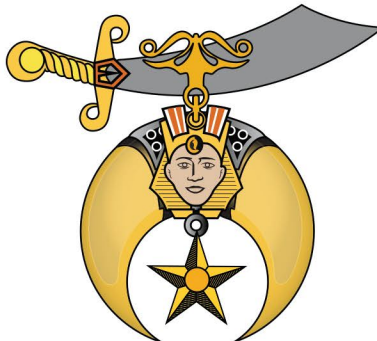

Greeting's Nobles,

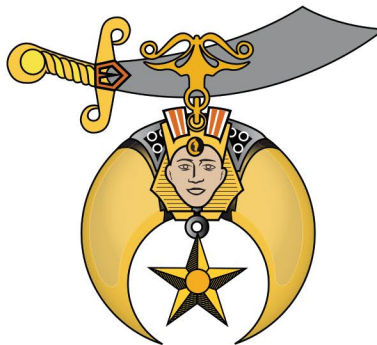

# Oriental Guide's notes

## Time Management, A Balancing Act

One day, as we are entering something into our calendar, reality quickly sets in: between stated meetings, degrees, practices, committees, clubs, units and Shrine events, your calendar is vanishing faster than the buffet at post-meeting refreshment. The question is now: how do I, or can I, make it all work. Managing your time effectively as a Mason, Shriner and elsewhere isn't just about avoiding burnout—it is a fundamental application of our Masonic tools. Here are some things to consider when trying to balance the demands of the Lodge, the Shrine, other Masonic bodies, community service and the most important commitments of all: your family and your livelihood.

### 1. Remember what you learned in the Entered Apprentice Degree

We learned about the 24-inch gauge, representing the 24 hours of the day. We are taught to divide it into three equal parts:

- Eight hours for the service of God and a distressed worthy brother
- Eight hours for our usual vocations
- Eight hours for refreshment and sleep

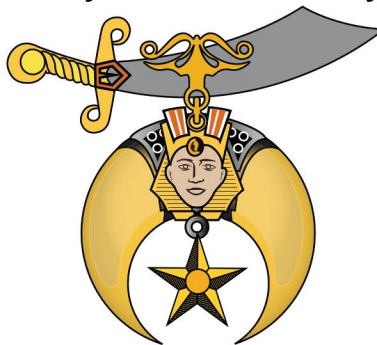
Use this tool as a mental check. When asked to take on a new role, ask yourself: "Which part of my gauge am I stealing this time from?"

### 2. Set-up Your Masonic Priority Pyramid

Your time commitments should reflect a clear hierarchy:

- |         |                        |
|---------|------------------------|
| / \     | 1. Etc...              |
| / \     | 2. Third in importance |
| / \     | 3. Next in importance  |
| / ___ \ | 4. Most important      |

Each of us must determine our own hierarchy. A Shrine parade or a ceremonial event conflict with a Blue Lodge, community, or a home/family event... What takes precedence? Knowing your pyramid prevents you from over-extending yourself at the top of the pyramid while the foundation crumbles.

### 3. Learn the Power of the "Masonic No"

Freemasons are naturally inclined to say yes; charity and service are baked into our DNA. Saying yes to something new may mean saying no to something else—often your family. The Golden Rule of Masonic Service: It is better to be a highly effective, reliable member of one committee than a checked-out, exhausted member of five. Know your limits. If you are asked to take on a role you don't have time for, use a polite but firm formula: "Brother/Noble, I deeply appreciate the trust you are placing in me, but to keep my 24-inch gauge balanced, I cannot give that role the attention it deserves."

### 4. Sync and Share Your Calendars

If you are balancing commitments, you need a digital calendar (like Google Calendar or Apple Calendar) shared with your spouse or family.

- **Block out the year early:** When Lodge, Shrine and other Masonic bodies templates come out for the year, drop the stated meetings, ceremonials, annual fundraisers and major events into the calendar (including Family & Community).

- **Account for travel and practice:** Don't just block out time for a meeting. Factor in preparation time, drive time and the inevitable "fellowship" afterward.

### 5. Combine Fellowship with Family

The Shrine, in particular, is famous for being family-friendly, offering family picnics, parades, and social events.

- Look for opportunities where your family can join you in service or fellowship
- If an event is strictly "tyled" (members only), ensure you pair it with dedicated, uninterrupted family time later in the week

### 6. Your Cable-Tow

It is yours and yours alone and only you can determine its length.

### The Final Trestleboard

Brotherhood and philanthropy are noble pursuits, but a Mason who neglects his family or health to serve, is missing the core lesson of the Craft. By treating time as a finite, sacred resource, you will not only become a more effective Mason and Shriner, but you will also find greater joy in the moments you do spend within the gates of the Temple and the Oasis.

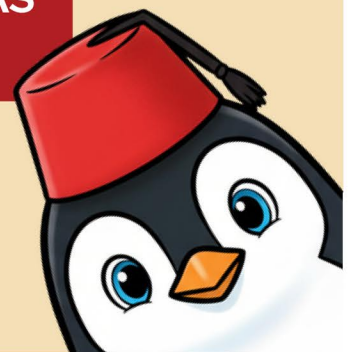
