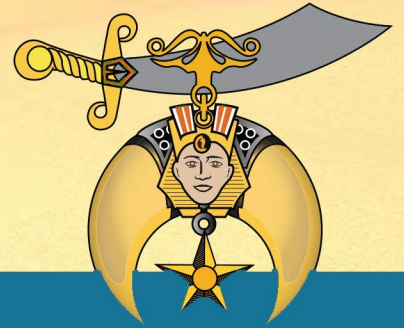

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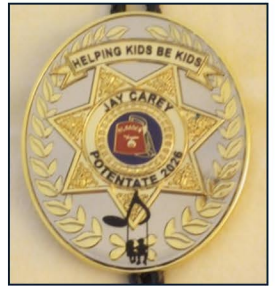
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Potentate's notes

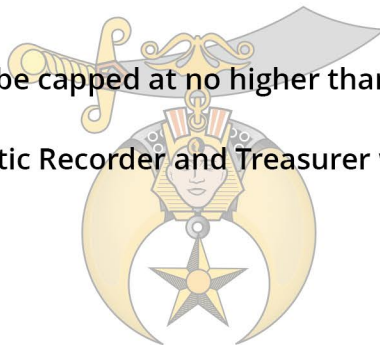


We have just returned from the Shriners International Annual Session tired, glad to be home and away from the 95% humidity. The annual session was very well attended and the legislation, election of Imperial Officers for the next year accomplished and granting Dispensations and Charters all accomplished. Several items of note for the Nobility is the financial issues that were voted on. The Article dealing with the reimbursement for spouses attending session would not receive reimbursement of travel expenses was defeated, so Nobles take your spouse with you. The elimination of the \$20.00 per day per diem for Nobles attending was passed. This \$20.00 was in addition to the regular per diem that remains covering hotels and expenses related to housing that is still to be paid. For clarification, the Per Diem that is paid is only for the delegates that are elected and attend representing their Temple.

Now for the major issue of the Per Capita Tax. After much discussion and an amendment added, the Article was approved. The Per Capita is to be set as follows:

- (1) Temple year 2027 - per capita will be \$50.00 plus the sum of the annual percentage increase in the U.S. CPI measured as of December 31, 2025 plus the annual percentage decrease membership of Shriners International measured as of December 31, 2025.
- (2) Temples after 2027 the annual per capita tax will be calculated by taking the previous temple year's annual per capita tax, adding the sum of the annual percentage increase in the U.S. CPI plus the annual percentage decrease in the membership of Shriners International as of December 31st for the most recent year.
- (3) The maximum increase shall be capped at no higher than \$5.00.

I am so glad that we have fantastic Recorder and Treasurer who will be able to figure this all out.



Potentate's notes

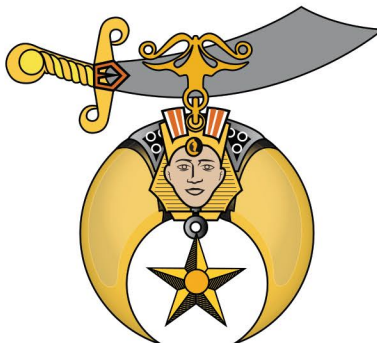
In other legislation and action, Paraguay was granted it's Charter and is now added to fully active Temples. Dispensations were approved and presented to Cyprus and Cote d'Ivoire (giving Shriners International it's first Temple in Africa) and Ecuador.

This is the new Imperial Divan officers for this 2026-2027 year.

On behalf of myself, First Lady Winnie and Noble Kris Torrey we want to express our thanks for allowing us to represent our Temple at this year's Annual Session. We were able to make new acquaintances and renew old ones. It is very important to support our Temple delegates each year to provide a voice in the governance of our Shrine Fraternity.

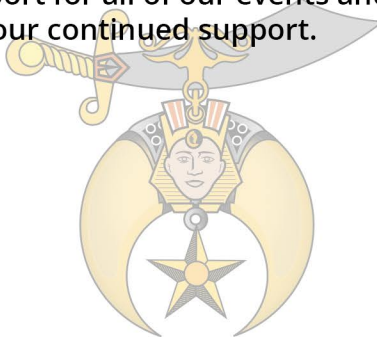

Greeting's Nobles,

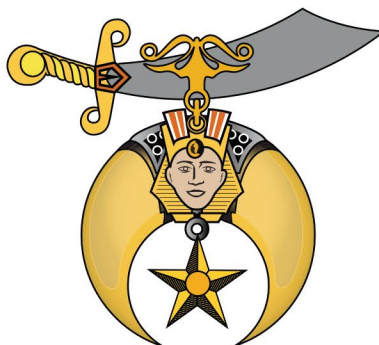

The list is updated frequently and is available for anyone to refer to and purchase.

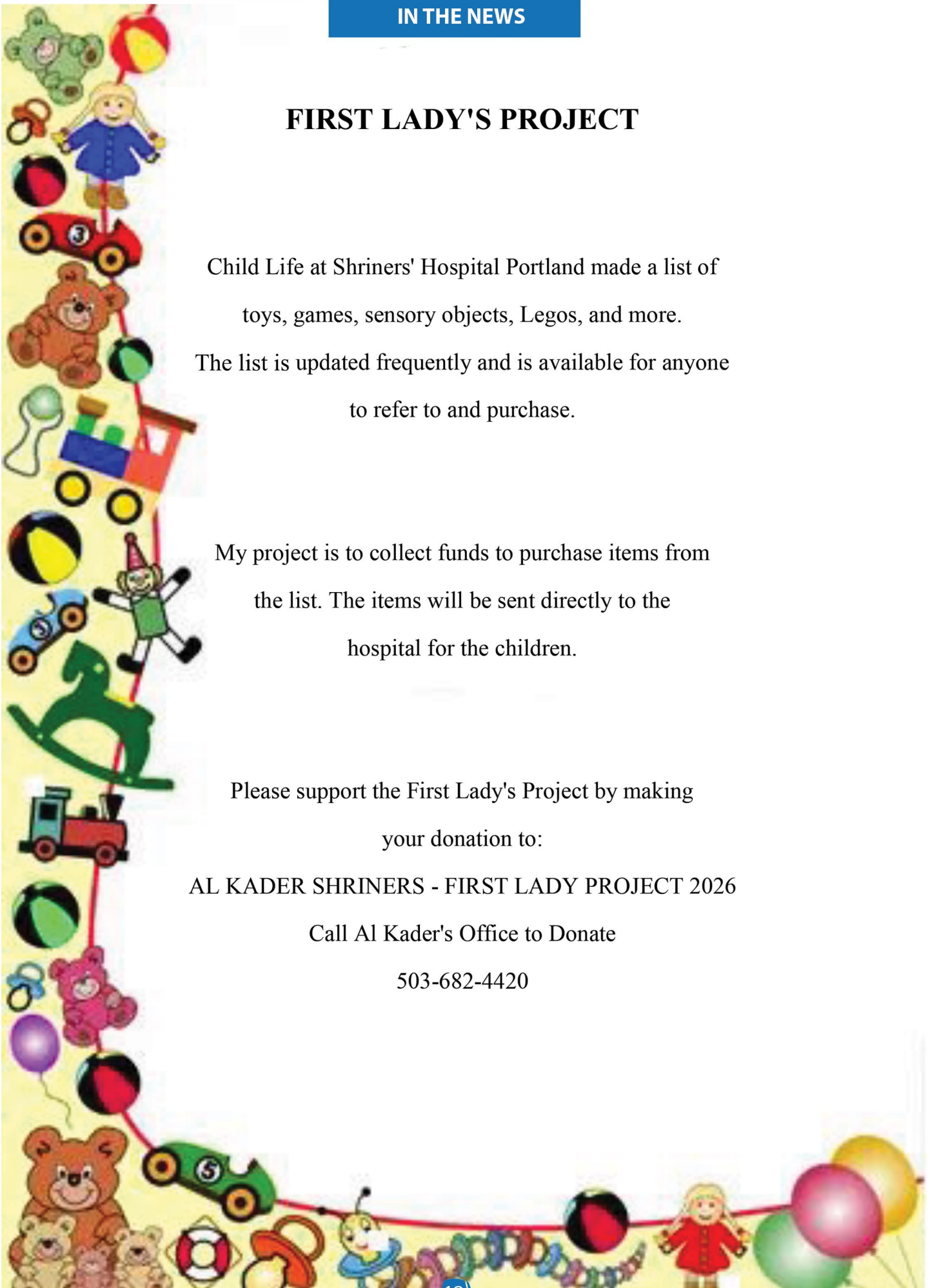

NEWS FROM CENTRAL OREGON



COLLABORATION

Collaboration is defined as, “two or more organizations working together to achieve a common goal or create value.” With volunteer and fraternal organizations, such as the Shrine, we should all be looking at different ways we can collaborate with other groups.

Let’s face it, we are here to work for supporting Shriners Children’s and those it serves and we struggle with fundraisers and making money to give to Shriners Children’s. What better way than to form an alliance with a company that supports what we do and have them work with us to generate some funds for the Hospital. Sounds simple but it takes some work.

So, how do you create an alliance? Getting out and talking with people, is the first step. Be knowledgeable about the Shrine and our hospital system. You don’t need to know everything, but enough to be able to share with people, especially about the Hospital. We are here to help kids and they can help us help them! “Help us help kids!”

Once you create that relationship, keep it alive by keeping in touch with them and not just when you want them to donate. Try to keep them involved, invite them to one of your dinners or meetings and recognize them.

In Central Oregon, we have developed several partnerships over the years, which has not only been rewarding but advantageous. These include grocery stores, medical offices, and other businesses, including restaurants. Each of these have supported us in our endeavors, especially the Crabfeed and the Food Caravan. An example of supporting those who support us, is our monthly Fez Lunches. Each lunch we attend are from businesses who have contributed to the silent auction for the crabfeed. We also visit with them about why we are there and again, thank them for supporting us as we are supporting them!

Recognition for these businesses are important. Once you have them, you want to make certain that you cultivate that alliance and make certain that it remains or grows. Then you can move onto another

collaboration with another business. One of our more recent collaborations is with Osprey Physical Therapy. Through being a patient and getting to know the owner (talking about the Shrine) they wanted to help. Not only do they support the Crabfeed with a corporate table and a donation for the auction, but they wanted to do more. This last June they wanted to do an aid station at a large tennis tournament but, being a new business didn't have a tent. We formed an alliance and used the Club's branded popup for their aid station and they asked for donations for the Club. It was a great way to get the Fez out, while providing a service! We are planning to expand it for next year.

Another partnership, one of our oldest ones, is with Local Acres grocery store. This began over 10 years ago, when we approached them about the Food Caravan. They provide us with the food at their cost, which gives us a great deal more food for the Hospital. They in turn also gives us a donation for the Crabfeed. This is probably one of the most important alliances we have, that supports the Hospital and our Club.

Advertising, in any form, is vital for the Shrine and the Hospital. Forming an alliance, partnership or collaboration is essential and a perfect way of letting people know about us and what we are and who we support!

Any Club or Unit can create a partnership; you just need to go out and ask. Be professional, but don't be afraid to ask. The only thing they can say is no, and it is not personal it is business.

LEADERS IN CARE PERIODICAL HONORS LOCAL BEND MAN

The summer edition of Leaders In Care magazine had an article that probably you overlooked. It was entitled "Businessman Leads by Example With Significant Bequest to Shriners Children's", which could easily have gone unnoticed. It seems like we acknowledge these stories but usually do not pay a great deal of attention to them. But, as Paul Harvey (for us older people) would say, now for "the rest of the story!"

This businessman has lived in the Bend area for well over 50 years, having created an extensive automotive business that sold luxury and collectors cars all over the world. He was born in

Businessman Leads by Example With Significant Bequest to Shriners Children's

"The more I give, the more I get." These words, shared by a friend early in his automotive career, stuck with Tom Collier. "My clients are some of the finest people in the world, and this advice has shaped my giving ever since," he said.

Now retired after 62 years in the automotive industry, Tom plans a significant bequest to Shriners Children's, split between the Portland and Spokane locations. "I was born in Washington and started my career there, but I made my money in Oregon, so I want to give back to the communities that shaped me," he shared.

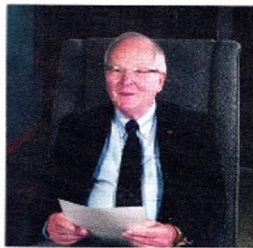
Born at Deaconess Hospital in Spokane, just across from Shriners Children's, Tom has stayed connected to his hometown. He belongs to The Spokane Club and was part of the original Friends of the Historic Davenport Hotel. Tom began his automotive career in Washington before relocating to Bend, Oregon. He later founded Classic Motor Car Company and sold luxury cars worldwide.

A longtime community leader, Tom served on the Bend Chamber of Commerce Board and is a 50-year Rotary member, raising substantial funds for their foundation. In the late 1980s, he purchased 200 acres in Bend as an investment, including a 70-acre solar farm.

Tom's first introduction to Shriners was a hardworking, sophisticated uncle he admired who was a Mason and a Shriner. When thinking about his legacy and where to donate the land, he chose Shriners Children's.

"A friend of mine had polio as a child and traveled alone on a train from eastern Oregon to Shriners Children's Portland for surgery. He later received treatment at Shriners Children's Spokane," said Tom. "I am amazed by how many friends and community members have been touched by Shriners Children's care. The more people I chat with, the more I hear of others who have been helped."

"There's a quote about how the most honorable and enjoyable way to use money is giving it to others, and that is what I try to do — to leave the earth a little better as we pass through it," said Tom. His significant estate gift will leave 200 acres to Shriners Children's, and the 70-acre solar farm on his land will provide a 60-year flow of income to benefit patients for many years.
